

# VISIT OF THE DELEGATION OF KOREAN ASSOCIATION OF SOCIAL SCIENTISTS

## UGANDA

### 1. Composition of the delegation

### 2. Program of the visit

The delegation arrived on **Monday 13<sup>th</sup> October, 2014**, 1300hrs at Entebbe International Airport. They were received at the airport by:

The delegation was hosted with a welcome dinner by Rt. Hon. Kirunda Kivejinja - senior Presidential advisor at Hotel Africana. Among other people who attended were: Lt. Col. Henry Matsiko, Lawrence Mayambala, Hon. Kabakumba Matsiko, Ambassador and Counselor of DPRK Kampala Embassy, Daniel Rugarama and Newton Balenzi of Pan African Movement.

Rt. Hon. Kirunda Kivejinja in his remarks commended the great transformations in DPRK all which are based on exploits of Juche idea and thanked the delegation for coming to Uganda. Prof. Ri Song Chol, Secretary General of KASS, head of delegation noted that it was during the International conference on Juche idea in April 2014 in Pyongyang that Lt. Col.
